

Nature of the Beast 2016

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For as long as humans have made art, animal imagery has played an important and central role. The prehistoric Lion Man of Hohlenstein Stadel, Anubis and Horus of ancient Egypt, the Hindu gods Ganesh and Hanuman, the orca and bear totems of the Haida, ostriches, aardvarks and eland in Bushman engravings, as well as the lamb and wolf of European Medieval sculpture, are but a few examples of how closely associated animal images are with the culture of their makers.

Throughout the ages Man has used the beast as a means of understanding himself, and even today in the 21st century, animals continue to be an important vehicle for artists of many different backgrounds. Our exhibition is a powerful demonstration of this relationship and celebrates the diversity of expression alive in contemporary art.

The simplified form of Michael Cooper's 'Anteater' has a deeply sensual beauty which stems from an intuitive paring-down of the form to reveal the very essence of the creature. In contrast, but of equal beauty and fascination, Nick Bibby gives us a 'warts and all', anatomically perfect rendition in 'Elephant Seal' and 'Walrus'. Bryan Kneale too brings a scientific eye to 'Sea Lion', providing us with an insight into the inner structure, usually hidden beneath the skin.

Structure of a different nature is wonderfully illustrated by Lynn Chadwick's 'Beast X' which, like a crab, wears its skeleton on the outside and reveals Chadwick's intricate working method. Method is also clear and undisguised in Christie Brown's mythical 'Entre Chien et Loup: Jackal', where the bronze surface still retains the impression of textured sheets of raw clay, slumped and compressed together.

With references to poetry, myth and literature, Deborah van der Beek's exploration of a skull gives 'Tyger' mystery and power beyond direct representation. With a similarly totemic feel, Eduardo Paolozzi's Anubislike 'Baboon' displays a wise and solemn presence like a contemporary re-working of an Egyptian animal god.

The animal in us however, is most apparent in Jon Buck's work. His sinuous 'Marked Cat' for instance, eloquently conveys the seductive beauty of the independent feline. Buck also makes a visual pun, associating the stamped pattern on the sculpture with proprietorial behaviour.

In his pair of 'Hartmann's Mountain Zebras', Jonathan Kingdon is primarily making a scientific statement about the evolution of the zebra and its stripes, and how indelibly they are bound together. At the same time he clearly celebrates the mesmerising perfection of animal markings. Zooming in ever closer with his lens in the 'Fabric of Africa' series, Steve Russell focusses solely on pattern and keeps us guessing as to the origin of his images.

The nature of the beast is that it can display many attributes: beauty, instinct, power, savagery, gentleness, elusiveness, mystery and wisdom. Thus today, 'the animal' continues to be a potent and relevant source of inspiration for artists and a useful tool with which to observe and think about ourselves.








Patterns of Process: The Order of Chaos I 2010 Jon Buck Charcoal











Evolution III (Porpoise)






